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Online Volunteer Training Options!

New for 2017, volunteers with at least two previous years of volunteer experience may complete their required training online.

About the Training

- Completed online through 4HOnline (software we use for enrollment)
- Please plan 90—120 minutes. The time needed will vary by person. The training does not need to be done in one sitting - you may leave the training at the end of any module.
- To meet requirements you must complete three modules
 1. Year 1 OSU Policy 1.50 Child Abuse and Neglect Training
 2. OSU Policy 1.50 Child Abuse and Neglect Quiz
 3. Any additional module of your choice
 - 8 Key Elements
 - Club Structure
 - Name & Emblem
 - Club Financials
 - Membership
 - Mission, Vision, Values



Who Can Do This?

- Current 4-H Volunteers in Sandusky County who have completed at least two years of previous, continuous volunteer service (2015 and 2016).

How to Register

- Send an email requesting log-in instructions to soule.12@osu.edu
- You will get an email from 4HOnline with a temporary password and a fact sheet from Gwen with more specific instructions.

Must be completed prior to April 1st.

Please note that use of the online system is a pilot program and may or may not be continued in the future. Also note: At least one volunteer for each club must still attend an in person training (Advisor Update or Mini-Conference) to obtain a club packet.

Join us for a 4-H Volunteer Mini-Conference!

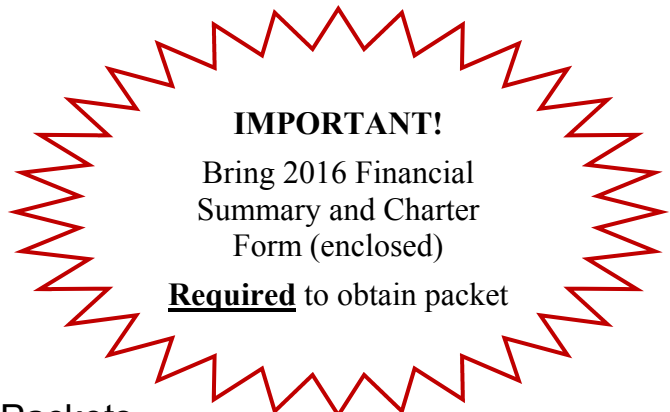
Every volunteer will complete the state-mandated training and a brief update, then each volunteer can choose the topics of interest or use to them.
